STACKING TEMPLATE

The following template is only a guide to help you design a policy for your specific site needs. Please follow all provincial legislation regarding stacking.

- 1. Ensure you use a flat firm surface when stacking lumber.
- 2. Pulpwood and log piles should be not be stacked higher than 4 m high.
- 3. During spring ensure stability of log and pulpwood piles as snow underneath melts.
- 4. Place sticks underneath lumber piles to allow easy pick up by forklifts.
- 5. Lifts of lumber should only be stacked to a maximum of 4 lifts high.
- 6. Taper edges of log and pulpwood piles to prevent wood from falling.
- 7. Ensure stacks are straight, neat and not leaning.
- 8. Do not climb on stacks.
- 9. Only equipment operator allowed on stacking equipment while in operation.
- 10. No one is allowed around stacks while equipment is in operation.
- 11. All stacking equipment should be inspected regularly and in good repair.
- 12. Ensure equipment is operating within its load limits.
- 13. Ensure stacking equipment is free from debris to reduce fire hazards.
- 14. Hydraulic leaks on equipment need to be fixed immediately.
- 15. Equipment operators should have a valid power line hazard certificate for the province of Newfoundland and Labrador.
