



Message from the Executive Director

It's that time of year again when the snow is going and we are getting in the last few rides on our sleds. Old man winter has had his fun and no doubt will give us another poke or two before he goes. As spring takes hold and the daylight hours grow longer we must remember to be careful out on the trails as objects and obstacles are now showing through the snow and can cause serious hazards. Please stay off any ice surfaces as the ice has become thin and unsafe for travel. In most parts of the province we experienced thinner ice thicknesses than normal and as such have

more dangerous ice conditions than we are used to.

Ice fishing ends on the island on April 15 and regular trout fishing opens again on May 15. Even though the summer fishing season may be open does not mean the water is warm.

There are still fatalities every year due to people being in the water and succumbing to the cold temperatures. It is also very important that people wear life jackets or PFD's when out enjoying a day on the water. Too often people don't think they need to wear a PFD because they are good swim-

mers or its not going to happen to them. Some people use it for an extra cushion on their seat. They are fine with the thought that its on the boat with them and readily available in case of an emergency. The problem is that an emergency can happen without warning and you can't push the pause button to get your PFD. Always wear the appropriate clothing and safety gear to match your activities.
